

North Carolina FCCLA State Leadership Conference Internship Information

Family, Career and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA) is a nonprofit National Career and Technical Student Organization for young men and women in Family and Consumer Sciences education in public and private school through grade 12. Since 1945, FCCLA members have been making a difference in their families, careers and communities by addressing important personal, work and societal issues through Family and Consumer Sciences education. Today 164,000 members in 5,400 states: including the Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico.

North Carolina is seeking 1 member per district for internships at the State Leadership Conference to be held at the Koury Convention Center in Greensboro, NC, April 27-29, 2020. All students selected will be required to attend an orientation session the evening of April 26th. The opportunities will include: assistance in general conference organization, Competitive Events, Exhibitor booths, and workshop activities.

Eligibility

- Affiliated member in grades 8th - 12th.
- Must have attended at least one State Leadership Conference from any state.
- Any candidate competing in STAR events must indicate this on the application. This will not impact your eligibility to be selected as an intern.
- Strong organization skills, ability to multitask efficiently, ability to communicate effectively with students and adults, an enthusiastic and positive attitude, and a passion for FCCLA.

Internship Requirements

- Must attend a webinar to be held on Monday, Mar. 30th.
- Attendance is required on Sunday, April 26th for a face-to-face orientation meeting at the Koury Convention Center from 6:00 pm - 8:00 pm. (Dinner will be provided.)
- Internship will include working on-site during the North Carolina FCCLA State Leadership Conference at the Koury Convention Center on April 27-29, 2020. Please ensure that you are registered and paid, attendant with your chapter.
- All interns will complete a reflection video on how the value of the internship deepened your understanding of FCCLA.

How to Apply

- Interested students should submit a completed application form, two letters of recommendation (one from your current adviser and one from a person of your choice; may not be a parent/guardian, family members or student) and a 30-60 second video explaining why you would make the best intern.
